Rev18:1 After this I saw another angel coming down from heaven. He had great authority, and the earth was illuminated by his splendor.

1. What Babylon had as a lifestyle.

(1) They welcomed evil into their lives/homes.

Rev 18:2 With a mighty voice he shouted: “Fallen! Fallen is Babylon the Great! She has become a dwelling for demons and a haunt for every impure spirit, a haunt for every unclean bird, a haunt for every unclean and detestable animal.

(2) Love for immorality & things became normal.

Rev 18:3 For all the nations have drunk the maddening wine of her adulteries. The kings of the earth committed adultery with her, and the merchants of the earth grew rich from her excessive luxuries.”

2. God speaks truth & throws them a rope.

(1) Refuse to get caught up in wrong things.

Rev 18:4 Then I heard another voice from heaven say: “Come out of her, my people,’ so that you will not share in her sins, so that you will not receive any of her plagues;

(2) Lost sense of right & wrong things get worse.

Rev 18:5 for her sins are piled up to heaven, and God has remembered her crimes.

3. What Babylon will receive from God.

(1) They end up suffering double pain.

Rev 18:6 Give back to her as she has given; pay her back double for what she has done. Pour her a double portion from her own cup. 7 Give her as much torment and grief as the glory and luxury she gave herself. In her heart she boasts, ‘I sit enthroned as queen. I am not a widow; I will never mourn.’

(2) Babylon will be totally destroyed.

Rev 18:8 Therefore in one day her plagues will overtake her: death, mourning and famine. She will be consumed by fire, for mighty is the Lord God who judges her.

4. Babylon's reaction as life is wrecked.

(1) The kings *mourn* over all the destruction.

Rev 18:9 "When the kings of the earth who committed adultery with her and shared her luxury see the smoke of her burning, they will weep and mourn over her. 10 Terrified at her torment, they will stand far off and cry: "Woe! Woe to you, great city, you mighty city of Babylon! In one hour your doom has come!"

(2) Business's placed *hope* in the wrong place.

Rev 18:11 "The merchants of the earth will weep and mourn over her because no one buys their cargoes anymore— 12 cargoes of gold, silver, precious stones and pearls; fine linen, purple, silk and scarlet cloth; every sort of citron wood, and articles of every kind made of ivory, costly wood, bronze, iron and marble; 13 cargoes of cinnamon and spice, of incense, myrrh and frankincense, of wine and olive oil, of fine flour and wheat; cattle and sheep; horses and carriages; and human beings sold as slaves. 14 "They will say, 'The fruit you longed for is gone from you. All your luxury and splendor have vanished, never to be recovered.' 15 The merchants who sold these things and gained their wealth from her will stand far off, terrified at her torment. They will weep and mourn 16 and cry out: "Woe! Woe to you, great city, dressed in fine linen, purple and scarlet, and glittering with gold, precious stones and pearls! 17 In one hour such great wealth has been brought to ruin!" . . .

(3) Captains of ships faced financial *ruin*.

Rev 18:17 . . . "Every sea captain, and all who travel by ship, the sailors, and all who earn their living from the sea, will stand far off. 18 When they see the smoke of her burning, they will exclaim, 'Was there ever a city like this great city?' 19 They will throw dust on their heads, and with weeping and mourning cry out: "Woe! Woe to you, great city, where all who had ships on the sea became rich through her wealth! In one hour she has been brought to ruin!"

Refuse to get wrapped up in what you own!

Rev 18:20 "Rejoice over her, you heavens! Rejoice, you people of God! Rejoice, apostles and prophets!

(2) They refused to _____ to truth - Now they _____.

Rev 18:20 For God has judged her with the judgment she imposed on you.

6. What God _____ to Babylon.

(1) Babylon will be overthrown *violently*.

Rev 18:21 Then a mighty angel picked up a boulder the size of a large millstone and threw it into the sea, and said: "With such violence the great city of Babylon will be thrown down, never to be found again.

(2) They will be _____ out - _____.

Rev 18:22 The music of harpists and musicians, pipers and trumpeters, will never be heard in you again. No worker of any trade will ever be found in you again. The sound of a millstone will never be heard in you again. 23 The light of a lamp will never shine in you again. The voice of bridegroom and bride will never be heard in you again. . . .
